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
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

: The rising individualization of Chinese youth has become a social phenomenon with increasing media and public attention. This study explores the diversity and dynamic construction of the life practice of young people. The study finds that the rise of individualization led to the "empty-nest" phenomenon, an intimate but distant way of life and emotional expression, not only based on the development of life, it also maintains the interaction between the individual and the family. Being intimate with distance is also a microcosm of the empty-nest phenomenon. The forces shape the empty-nest youth's self-exploration and compromise of the family. The dynamic response of the changes in China's social system during the transition from the rise of individual consciousness and self-right under the second modernity in the characteristics of the rise of individualization in the Chinese modernization and bring about changes of marriage and family in China.
